- How can data and technology be leveraged to improve people-centred access to justice, and what are the implications for privacy and trust?
- What innovative approaches can be taken to strengthen the link between the rule of law, access to justice, democracies and economic development?
- How can Justice Action Coalition help strengthen the movement for peoplecentred justice and the rule of law?
