







People-Centered Justice in Ukraine: Agenda for Breakout Sessions

The breakout sessions are meant to build on the discussions during the interactive session and discuss how a people-centered approach can resolve justice problems facing people in Ukraine. The breakout sessions are also meant to set the stage for follow-up virtual meetings that will explore a specific justice problem in-depth with the goal of developing a roadmap for action to ameliorate people's justice journeys in resolving the justice problem.

The topics of the three breakout sessions are:

Each session will have 40 minutes to explore the following:

- A brief introduction on the justice problem and how it impacts people's lives to be delivered by the Facilitator. (2 min)
- Discussion led by the Facilitator based on the following questions:
 - o What do we know about this problem? What data exists regarding the nature and size of the problem? Which groups of people are most affected by this problem? How as the COVID-19 pandemic exacerbated or changed this justice problem? 12 minutes
 - What effective solutions exist to resolve this problem and to address the underlying causes?
 What works? 12 min
 - How are justice actors supporting these solutions and where are they making matters worse?
 What are the ways that these problems can be prevented, addressed earlier or more efficiently? 12 min
 - O Which actors are involved at the state, municipal and local levels of government to address this justice problem and how can they better collaborate to resolve this problem? 10 minutes









Each session will have a rapporteur who will report back to the group at the large on the main findings of the discussion. Each rapporteur will have 3-4 minutes to present.
